Math's—Hazel Class

Hazel have been learning how to form and solve equations. They have practised solving one-step and two-step equations, checked their answers, and explained their reasoning clearly. For example, they have solved problems such as: Using diagrams, leading onto:

- $x+7=15$
- $3x=24$
- $2x+5=17$

It has been wonderful to see them tackling algebra and applying their skills.

$$4y + 4 = 24$$




Come and Watch your Child Learn—26.02.26


Start of the School Day
