# **PSHE vision**

To support our pupils to be responsible, respectful, resilient, and reflective learners, who are able to keep themselves safe, healthy and prepared for secondary school and life beyond.

# Intent

At South Hill, we follow the National Curriculum for the statutory requirements of 'Relationship and Sex Education', as well as The No Outsiders Project, Picture News and The Christopher Winter Project to reflect the needs of our pupils.

Our intent is to deliver a PSHE curriculum to:

- Teach pupils how to be successful citizens in our school community
- Teach pupils 'British Values' and to reinforce all elements of our school ethos: 'The South Hill Way'
- Ensure pupils know what a healthy relationship looks like; where they are valued and where equality exists; and to also ensure all families and individuals are 'represented' and 'seen'
- Teach pupils how to keep our bodies healthy and what it means to have a healthy lifestyle
- Teach pupils the facts about legal and illegal harmful substances and associated risks, including smoking, alcohol use and drug-taking
- Understand conception (Year 6 only)

Other elements of our PSHE programme are taught through subjects such as Science (where pupils will learn about the human body and reproduction), Computing (where pupils will learn about internet safety) and PE (where messages about keeping healthy will be reinforced) as well as by staff using opportunities, throughout the school day, to reinforce key concepts.

# **Implementation**

# **Impact**

Pupils will be assessed by teachers reviewing skills and knowledge (from the PSHE scheme of work). This will be recorded termly using our 'Foundation assessment tracker'.

Pupils will have developed ageappropriate knowledge and skills to help them understand:

- How to have a healthy lifestyle

Pupils will understand that all children and adults should be valued and treated equally.
