An introduction to 'Learning by questions'

What is 'Learning by questions' (LBQ)?



LBQ is an online learning platform which we use to set homework in KS2 at South Hill. It is a learning tool filled with question sets for Maths, English, Science and other subjects.

Why have we chosen to use LBQ?



- LBQ is easily accessible on any tablet, laptop or mobile.
- It is a question-based programme which gives immediate and constructive feedback as your child answers questions and data is sent immediately to your class teacher.
- Question sets are progressive with 4 levels and are aligned to the National Curriculum.
- To consolidate, revise and 'overlearn' what we are doing in class.
- Online learning will aid transition to secondary school, where most homework is set online.
- LBQ can be used in class (through live lessons) and at home (independent study).
- Most importantly, pupil and parent feedback has been extremely positive and engagement has been much better than with traditional paper-based homework.

How does my child access LBQ using the QR code?



- LBQ homework tasks are set on a Monday and pupils have 1 week to complete each task.
- To access LBQ, simply scan your child's unique QR code (this remains the same all year).
- This is by the far the easiest way – no login details needed!

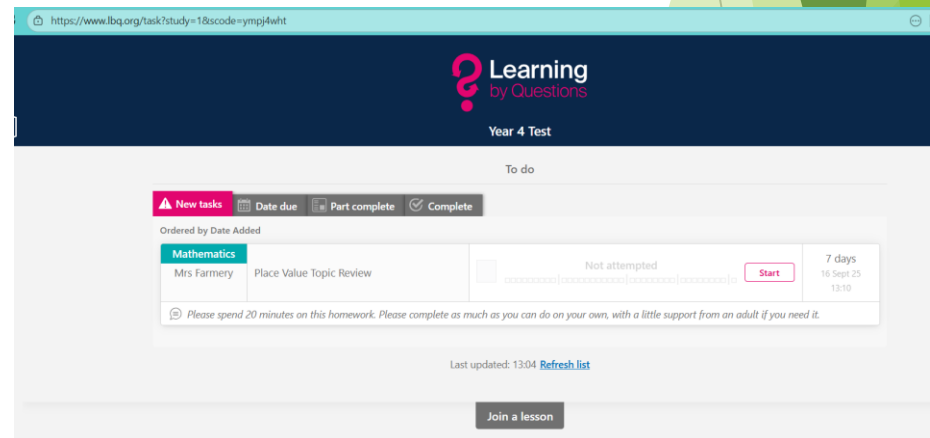

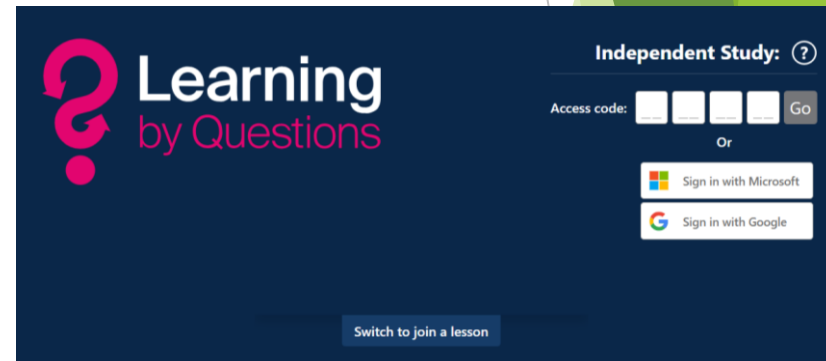
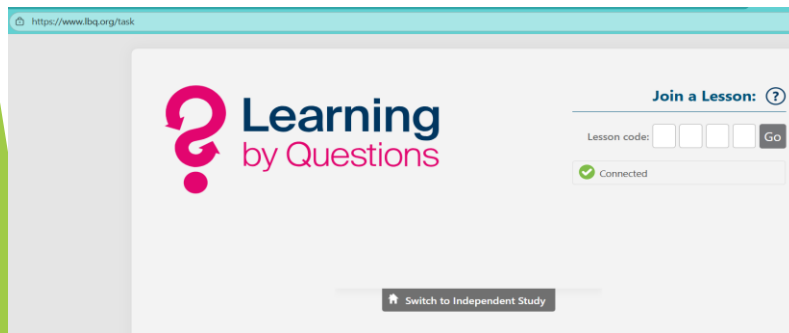
- This will take you straight to your child's start screen!



How does my child access LBQ using a laptop?



- To access LBQ on a laptop, go to www.lbq.org/task
- Click on 'Switch to independent study'. The screen will change to a navy-coloured screen.
- Now type in your access code, followed by your child's name and then your password. Details must match the information on your QR code.

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How does my child progress through the levels?

Progress is shown in the top bar as your child answers each question and is shown as a colour.

RED - This means the pupil has answered the question incorrectly.

ORANGE - This means the pupil has answered the question incorrectly but then retried the question and got it correct.

GREEN - This means the pupil has answered the question correctly on their first attempt.

BLUE - This means the question will be checked by your class teacher and cannot be marked by the computer.

A pupil needs to answer 70% of questions correctly to move onto the next level of learning.

'Learning by questions - FAQ's



How long should my child spend on 'LBQ' homework?

We would recommend 20 minutes on each task. This does not have to be in one go. The programme auto saves your progress.

Tasks will increase as your child moves up year groups. In Year 6, there is a separate 'Sats' booster programme on 'LBQ' which we use in school and at home.

How much help should I give my child?

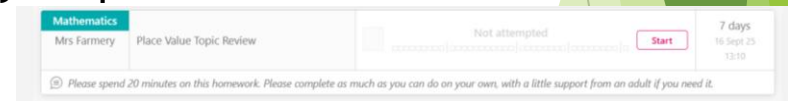
As little as possible! We want our learners to become as independent as possible.

Our best tips are to get your child to:

- Read the question carefully
- Use the picture prompts to help them and read the feedback/ help tips!
- Only complete the levels they can do with a little bit of help from you
- Do not push them to complete levels they find too difficult
- When you have completed a task, the block on your profile will be full

Are all children set the same task?

This depends on the task set. The 4 levels of each task range from WTS to GDS levels. Occasionally, teachers may set completely different tasks for individuals or groups of children according to their learning needs.



Why is the website skipping questions?

Occasionally, some tasks are set as 'randomiser' tasks. This means your child will get a random set of questions from the question set. They only need to answer the questions they are set as they will not be set every single one.
