Grammar Corner

This year we will be focusing on the teaching of grammar. Grammar is the glue which holds our language together. Grammar is a compulsory element of the National Curriculum, which means learners have to understand and be able



to use a range of specific grammatical features. Grammar helps us to read and to write effectively and is an important part of our communication. The grammar document we follow can be found here.

This week in Year 5 we have revised a grammar rule by using



and applying **expanded noun phrases** to our writing by describing a Viking god or goddess. **Expanded noun phrases** give more information about a noun. A child described the god Odin as being a tall, mysterious figure. The adjectives "tall" and "mysterious" help to describe Odin.

We look forward to keeping you updated on our grammar journey as the year progresses.
