

We take pride in the pastoral support we offer our pupils and families. We are delighted to have achieved the Wellbeing Award for our school. We have a dedicated Wellbeing team which focus on supporting pupils' personal development and welfare. Our Wellbeing team also signposts families to services they may need. Through our therapeutic approach to behaviour, we promote resilience and independence. We use the 'Zones of Regulation' across the school which is a behaviour approach used to teach pupils to self-regulate their emotions and to take ownership over their behaviour. Our aim is to ensure we have happy pupils who are ready to learn.

Curriculum

We are committed to ensuring we offer our pupils a curriculum that is creative and tailored to their needs. The Teaching and Learning team ensure that high expectations are at the forefront of our learning walks, book monitoring and lesson drop-ins. We aim to ensure that the pupils at South Hill experience a consistent 'Daily Diet,' of learning and that they learn in an environment which builds confidence. Our Creative Curriculum is key to building skills and developing curiosity. We want our learners to take risks and learn from errors in order to build resilience and an enjoyment of learning.

Our Curriculum



- A consistent progressive approach across the school curriculum.
- A strong 'Daily Diet' of core learning.
- High expectations set through regular monitoring from leaders.
- Lesson drop-ins conducted through the eyes of our pupils.

South Hill School Curriculum



Our Curriculum - Core subjects

We follow the 'National Curriculum' for all core subjects at South Hill.

- Maths we use HFL' Maths Essentials plans'.
- English we use our own planning as well as 'HFL plans'.
- Science we follow our own plans using a range of resources.

Assessment - Core subjects

Each term, class teachers spend time together moderating 'levels' for each pupil in their class using HFL/ TAF grids. These assessments are taken to 'Pupil progress meetings' where SLT spend time with class teachers analysing progress and attainment data. Next steps and interventions are planned to ensure further progress and to address any gaps in learning.

Feedback and marking

Feedback is given continually at South Hill and occurs throughout the four common stages of the learning process:

We believe feedback is most effective when it is delivered closest to the point of action and when it is given specifically and directly to an individual pupil or group of children.

Therefore, in all Key stages, verbal feedback will be the primary focus, with 'Green pen marking' also used, where needed.

How we structure our curriculum to ensure progression and equality for all learners.

Knowledge Organisers

As well as our 'Long term plans', we have a growing number of subjects using 'Knowledge Organisers' to help pupils and parents understand what information is being taught in each subject. These are linked to our 'LTP's' and show progression from one topic to the next.



Adaptations

We believe that every child has the right to a good education. Therefore, our plans are adapted to cater for different abilities to ensure pupils, where possible, can access the curriculum. This includes:

- 3 levels of differentiation (Challenge 1,2,3)
- A personalised curriculum, where needed
- Use of 'Pivats' levels to support pupils making 'small steps' of progress
- Interventions to address gaps in knowledge

Foundation subjects - Planning and Golden Threads

We follow the 'National Curriculum' for all foundation subjects at South Hill. We have created a 'Long term plan' for each subject; we also have 'Golden Threads' in each subject, which help us to ensure progression for all of our pupils.

Assessment in Foundation Subjects

We use a 'Foundation Subject Tracker' to complete assessments for each pupil in foundation subjects once a term. These are then analysed by our Subject leaders who use this data to look for patterns and next steps as well as to provide support and CPD to our class teachers for their subject.




Starting School -The EYFS Classroom
