The South Hill Way

Multiplication Tables Check



In Year 4, pupils sit the 'Multiplication Tables check' (MTC). This is an online test where the pupils are asked 25 questions on times tables 2 to 12. For every question, pupils have 6 seconds to answer, and in between the questions, there is a 3-second rest. Questions about the 6, 7, 8, 9, and 12 times table come up more often. The questions are generated randomly based on the rules of the MTC. The Government website for this test can be found here:

We would recommend that pupils spend 10 minutes a day reciting and learning their times and using 'Times Table Rockstars' to increase their speed.

Class Dojo will be used for Year group specific and whole school communication messages and reminders, as well as sharing learning and whole school messages once a week.


Please ensure you have downloaded the app. Please contact the school office if you need an access code.

South Hill Primary School School Uniform Policy

At South Hill School we believe that school uniform is advantageous to self-discipline, social cohesion and wellbeing. All parents, carers and pupils are requested to ensure that all pupils follow the school dress code. We are very proud of our pupils and of the way they are dressed at school.

Uniform may be purchased online from Mapac who stock all uniform including items with the school's crest. Non-branded items may be purchased from a variety of retailers. Please be aware that ordering the uniform can take up to two weeks.

Second-hand uniform is available from the school/ PTA. Please contact the school office.

School Uniform for all Pupils (required)

- . Bottle green fleece/Bottle green sweatshirt/ cardigan (with or without school crest)
- White blouse or white polo-shirt (with or without school crest)
- Grey skirt/ pinafore/ grey trousers
- White/ grey/ black/ green socks or tights
- Footwear: Sensible black school shoes not trainers (no lights or toys)

Warm Weather Uniform

- Short sleeved polo shirt or blouse (with or without school crest)
- Grey shorts
- Green and white striped or checked school dress/ playsuit
- Sun hat/ cap

Outside wear

Coat or jacket for outdoor break and lunchtimes

P.E. kit for all pupils (to be worn on PE days)

- Green sports T shirt
- Bottle green shorts (summer uniform)
- Plain black/ green joggers & plain tracksuit top/ school jumper/fleece (winter uniform)
- Black or white trainers
- Football shirts are not to be worn

Forest school

- Wellies/ old trainers
- A waterproof coat
- Appropriate clothing according to weather (gloves, hats, sunhats etc)

Swimming (Year 4)

- Towel
- Trunks/swimsuit (one piece not bikini)
- Goggles
- Swimming hat
- Carrier bag/water proof bag

All KS2 pupils must also have rucksack in green/ black (SH logo ones are available from the uniform suppliers)

All Reception and KS1 pupils must also have a book bag/ rucksack in green/ black (SH logo ones are available from the uniform suppliers)

Hair - All children with hair below the shoulder should have their hair tied back using green/ black hair accessories.

Nail Varnish – Nail varnish is <u>not</u> permitted.

Earrings – Stud earrings only. No earrings for PE. They must be taken out or taped for PE by the pupil. No other jewellery to be worn (with the exception of religious artefacts which must be removed for PE).

ALL ITEMS MUST BE MARKED WITH THE OWNER'S NAME. LOST PROPERTY IS COLLATED IN SCHOOL AND WILL BE
DISPLAYED TERMLY OUTSIDE BEFORE BEING DISPOSED OF


Homework



The Pupils will be given a 'pick and mix' homework grid at the beginning of each half term in their homework books.

Please choose one activity to complete each week and write the task they have completed against the week number. The Pupils will be expected to hand in their homework books each **Monday** so that the class teacher can check that homework has been completed. The class teacher will issue a Gold, Silver or Bronze homework certificate and feedback comment via 'Class Dojo'.

Pupils will also be given **spellings** to learn on a Wednesday, ready for a test the following Wednesday. We also expect them to practice times tables at home regularly using the app 'Times Table Rockstars', as well as reading at least five times per week.




Reading books



At the start of their reading journey, pupils will have three types of reading books: Prime, Power and Pleasure.

When pupils graduate from the 'Read Write Inc' phonics scheme, they will have two types of books – Power and Pleasure.



PRIME Books are linked to a RWInc Book that is used in phonics sessions and has matching sounds. These books are essential for decoding and for early reading.

POWER Books are levelled by book bands, they are from a variety of reading schemes. These books give a structured approach to children developing their reading further.

PLEASURE Books are 'real books' found in the school library and class reading areas.

Reading Records



Most pupils in KS2 will have two books; one book from our whole school reading scheme and one book for pleasure.

Reading scheme books will be changed **twice a week** on a **Monday and Friday**. Pupils can choose a reading book they would like to read from their colour book band.

Pupils are expected to read regularly at home and have their reading record signed by an adult **5 times per week** in their reading record book.

In class, Pupils will participate in regular reading Activities with their class teacher and TA and this will be shown by a stamp and/or short comment in their reading record.



Housekeeping



- Waterbottles please could we ask that every child has a named water bottle in school and this is taken home daily to be cleaned and refilled.
- **PE Day** Pupils need to wear their PE kit to school please on their PE day. This is:
 - Monday for Maple
 - Wednesday for Holly
- Swimming day

 Year 4 pupils go to swimming lessons
 on a Friday and will need to bring their swimming kit in
 on this day.
- Fruit snack Pupils can bring in a pot or piece of fruit/vegetable to have as a snack at playtime.





How can I help my child at home?



We would really encourage you to talk to your child regularly about what they have been learning about in school. A good question to ask is: "Tell me about your day."

We would also recommend:

- **Reading-** Ensure your child is reading at least 5 times a week and ask them questions about what they have read to ensure they understand and develop their comprehension skills. Read books to your child and try to use a wide variety of genres and types of book.
- **Verbal feedback-** ask your child about their learning daily and find out about their school day. Ask them what conversations they have had with their class teacher about their learning.
- Homework routine- Set a weekly timetable so that your child gets into a good routine of doing homework, including reading, practicing their spellings and times tables and completing homework tasks.
- Learning through play- Use games at home to practice key learning skills. For example, you could ask your child to write a story, act out a play, write a shopping list together, make a model, show you another way of completing a maths calculation- the possibilities are endless!
