Class News - Robins

Reception are learning about superheroes in our community. Last week our very own superhero Steven came to visit and tell us about how he helps people and keeps them well. The children enjoyed finding out about his job as a first aider with St John Ambulance, looking at his uniform and sticking his plasters all over each other!



Holly Class - SpaG

This week in Year 4, we learned how to use apostrophes to show ownership, and saw how the position of the apostrophe changes in singular and plural words. The children practised writing their own sentences, changing the meaning of them with differently placed apostrophes. For example, the dog's bowl is empty (one dog), and the dogs' bowl is empty (plural, multiple dogs). When reading at home, please encourage your child to look for these apostrophes and how they change the meaning in a sentence.

Silver Birch Class - Maths

This week in Silver Birch we have continued to look at fractions. We began the week continuing our learning with fractions of amounts and finding the whole. We have drawn bar models to show dividing by the denominator and multiplying by the numerator. We have also looked at the links between dividing and multiplying fractions and amounts.
